## INDIAN SCHOOL SALALAH SCRIPTS PHENOMENAL SUCCESS IN CLASS X AND XII EXAMINATIONS 2021

Indian School Salalah registered 100% passing percentage in the CBSE class X and XII board examinations 2021 and thus, the students here scripted phenomenal results and brought laurels to their school.

The much-awaited CBSE class X and XII results were declared in the month of July-August and the school, as it has been consistent in producing excellent results, this year too proved its academic brilliance by securing 100% results in both these board classes.

In class XII, 100% of students secured 73% and above and 99% of students secured distinction in Science stream. In the stream of Commerce, 100% of students secured first class marks and 84% of students passed the examination with distinction. In Humanities too, 100% of students secured 74% and above and 89% of students secured distinction.

Out of 168 students registered for class 12, Ms. Mansi Gururani topped the Science batch securing 97.2% in the exam, followed by Mast. Naman Verma with 96.8% and Mast. Aadesh Anil Agte and Ms. Priya Khatri who scored 96.2% marks. In Commerce, Ms. Ayra Fahad and Ms. Ishrat Jahan Puspita outdid the batch sharing 95.4% of marks. Ms. Anitta Elsa Mathew and Ms. Julianna Martin Miguel stood second with 95.2% and Mast. Job Thomas in the third position scoring 95%. Ms. Sahana Munagalachetty, Mast. Shihab Ahmed and Ms. Ishwarya Kumaresan stood first, second and third in Humanities scoring 96.2%, 94.2% and 92.8% marks respectively.

The Central Board of Secondary Education had called off its class X board examinations and class XII postponed claiming the exam to be held later after reviewing the pandemic situation on 1<sup>st</sup> June. However, the much debated and awaited topic, class XII examinations were also cancelled in view of the health and safety of students of utmost importance. CBSE prepared class X results on the basis of objective criterion developed by the board, while class XII results were based on internal and external assessments of class X, XI and XII with a credible, reliable, flexible, and valid alternative assessment and tabulation policy.

The President of the School Management Committee Dr. Syed Ahsan Jamil and other esteemed members of SMC and the Principal Mr. Deepak Patankar stood in admiration of class X and XII results and they highly praised the students for their spectacular performances and the teachers for their unstinting efforts.

## NABET ACCREDITATION PROCESS UNDERWAY

Indian School Salalah, established in 1981 as a CBSE affiliated Indian community school has grown leaps and bounds in its educational services and is reputed in the region of Dhofar. Its journey has been envisioned by the school management, Principal and staff.

By early 2020, Indian School Salalah started preparing itself for getting accredited and NABET (National Accreditation Board for Education and Training) certified under Quality Council of India, an autonomous body under HRD Ministry.





Journey for NABET Accreditation started by:

- o Preparing a School Manual covering all the aspects of the system.
- o Framing quality objectives in lines with Vision and Mission of the school.
- Attempting changes in the existing system for bringing effectiveness and transparency.
  - o Implementing 360° feedback mechanism in the teaching processes.
- Developing an annual curriculum plan to bring contextualization in the teaching learning process.
  - Understanding the needs of interested parties and fulfilling the quality objectives.

The School had already been following most of these procedures and the school is in the process of the inspection by the NABET accreditation team in 2021 and hopeful of getting the accreditation during this academic year itself which will be yet another milestone for the school.


#### MOTHERS' DAY (09/05/2021)














































































































































### CLASSES 3 & 4





Informative video links on World Heart Day were shared with the students on 27 Sept, 2021. Students made posters on the same.


