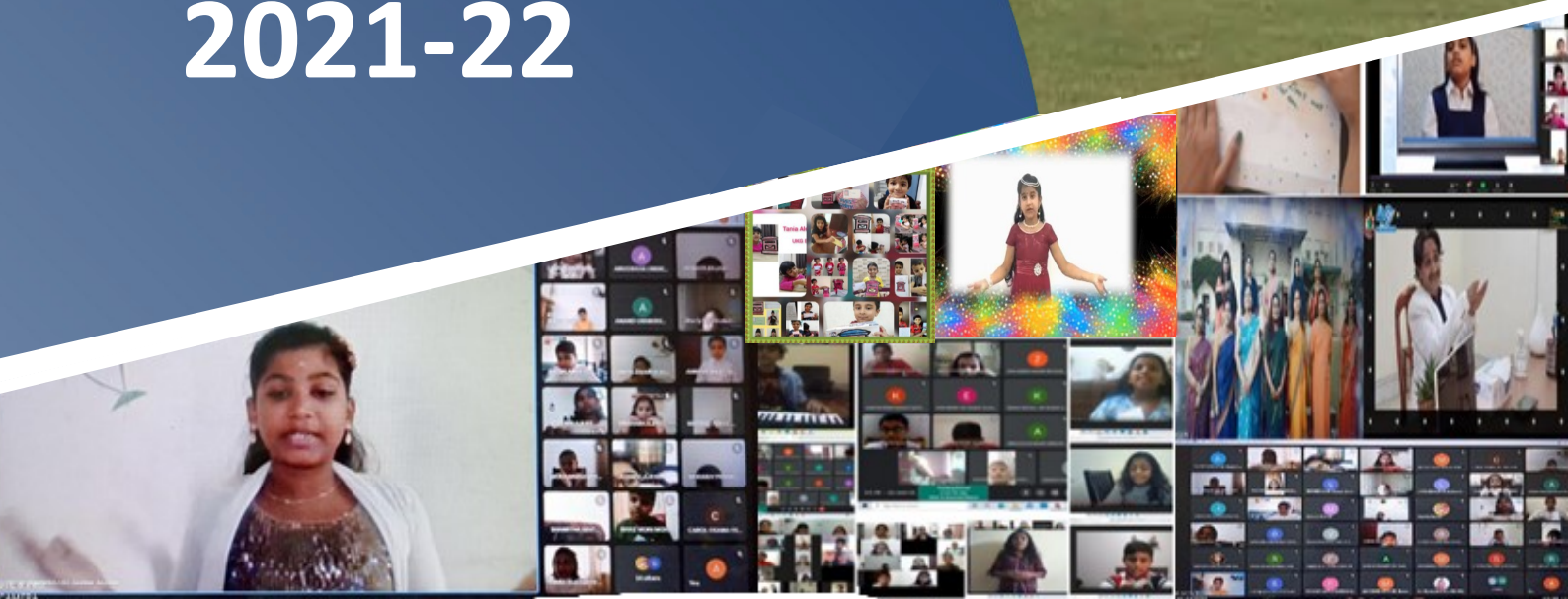

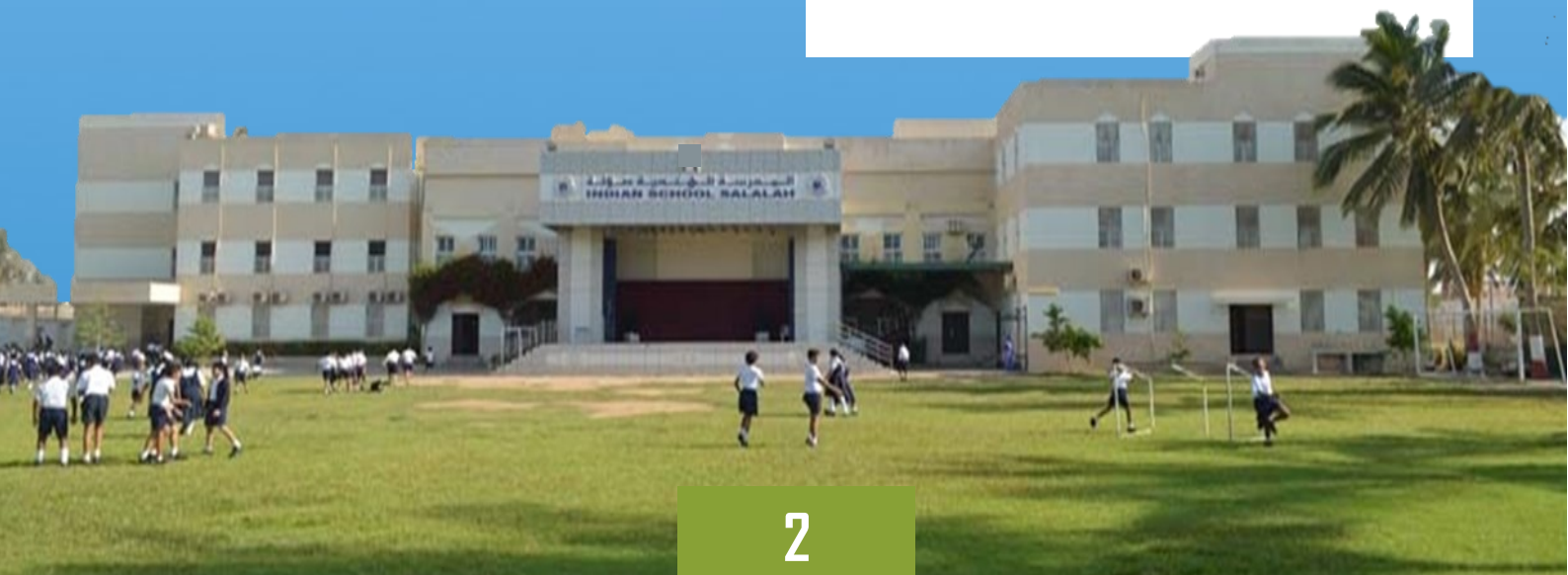

REPORT ON FIRE EXTINGUISHER DEMO

“Prepare and prevent, don’t repair and repent.” is the quote practised by Indian School Salalah.

To train the school staff to use various fire extinguishers in order to protect the children and themselves in case of any fire accident in future, a live demo session was organised on 18 Nov 2021 in Indian School Salalah. With the consent of the Chairman, H.S.E Sub Committee of SMC, Dr. Ambu Suresh and School Admin Mr. Sadathulla, H.S.E in charge Mr. Mohandass and 3D United Trading Co.L.L organized a live demonstration session on the appropriate use of Fire Extinguishers for the teaching staff (Class VII to XII) and all the non-teaching staff in the main building of the school.

HSE in charge Mr. Mohandass welcomed the principal, AVPs and the staff and briefed them about the importance of gaining knowledge about various classes of fire, appropriate fire extinguisher to be used, the availability and locations of fire extinguishers which are water, Co2 and Foam, water hose reel and main electric switches at our school premises. Mr. Vikram from 3D United Trading Co.L.L threw light on how to handle different types of fire extinguishers to extinguish fire like: removal of safety pins, how to hold the extinguishers, fire Point to be targeted etc. A few members of staff came forward and participated actively in the demo session.



BACK TO SCHOOL - POST PANDEMIC

COVID -19 pandemic has presented unprecedented challenges to the education system. The rush to slow down the spread of the virus led to closures of schools across the globe and gave way to online classes. Children were greatly impacted by the pandemic and the constraints imposed on schools.

5th and 24th of October 2021 were more overwhelming than ever before. Grade 12 were back to school on October 5th and the Kindergarten reopened on October 24th. One could observe the mixed feelings of excitement and joy among the students, parents, and teachers at Indian School Salalah as the school turned lively for onsite classes after being closed for nearly 18 months.

The President of SMC Dr. Syed Ahsan Jamil and the other esteemed members of the SMC along with Principal Mr. Deepak Patankar and his devoted team of teachers were elated as they received the students back to school campus for their regular classes.

After many weeks of distance learning, which was challenging for children, parents, and teachers alike, the willingness to go back to normal learning processes is now noticeably high; everyone has displayed a readiness to comply with the new safety regulations set by the MOH and MOE. All the standard safety procedures are observed as children enter the school building: such as thermal screening, vaccination certificate verification and wider seating arrangements. A detailed set of guidelines and procedures were provided to the parents and students one week prior to the commence-

ment of the regular classes.

The President of SMC Dr. Syed Ahsan Jamil, other esteemed members of the School Management Committee and Principal Mr. Deepak Patankar expressed their gratitude to the Ministry of Education for granting the permission to reopen the school and conveyed their best wishes to the children as well as teachers. They also advised the students to follow the safety protocols precisely.

The willingness and zeal of the parents, children, and administration to adapt to the new set of in-school rules makes the learning process possible even during such unprecedented times.

ACTIVITIES (OCTOBER 2021 TO DECEMBER 2021)

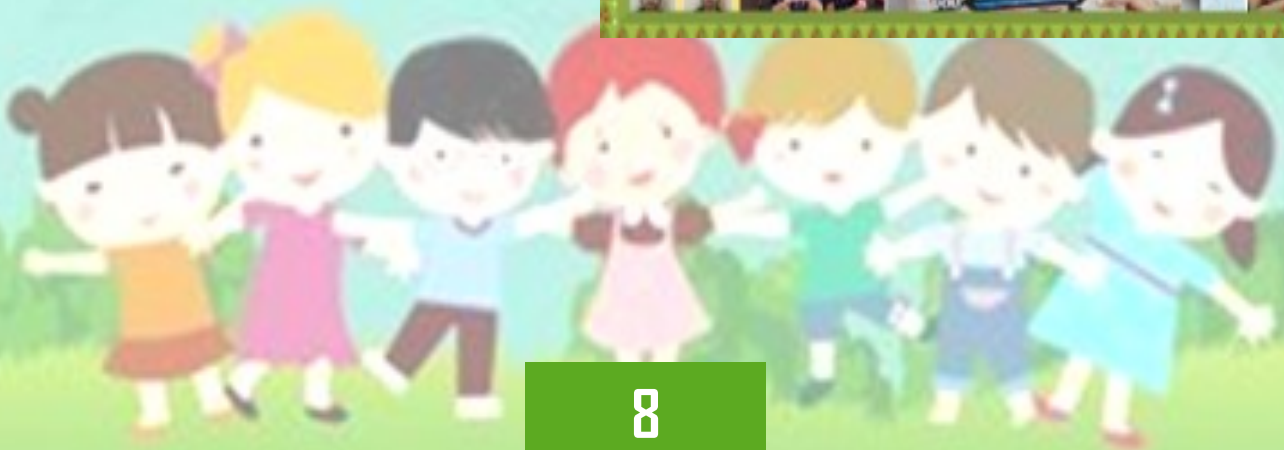
1. PLANT KINGDOM- GERMINATION OF SEED (06/10/2021)

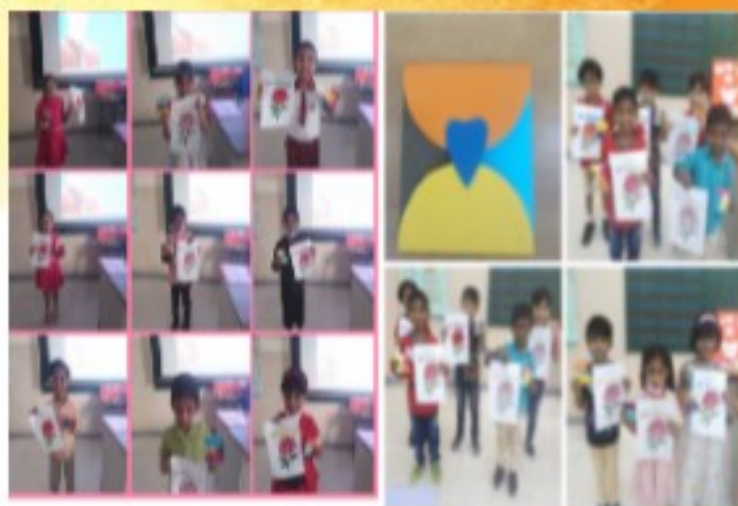
4. Diwali Celebration (03/11/2021)

Celebration of national days strengthens the unity amongst the individuals of a community and empowers them to seek their roles and responsibility for national integrity and development.

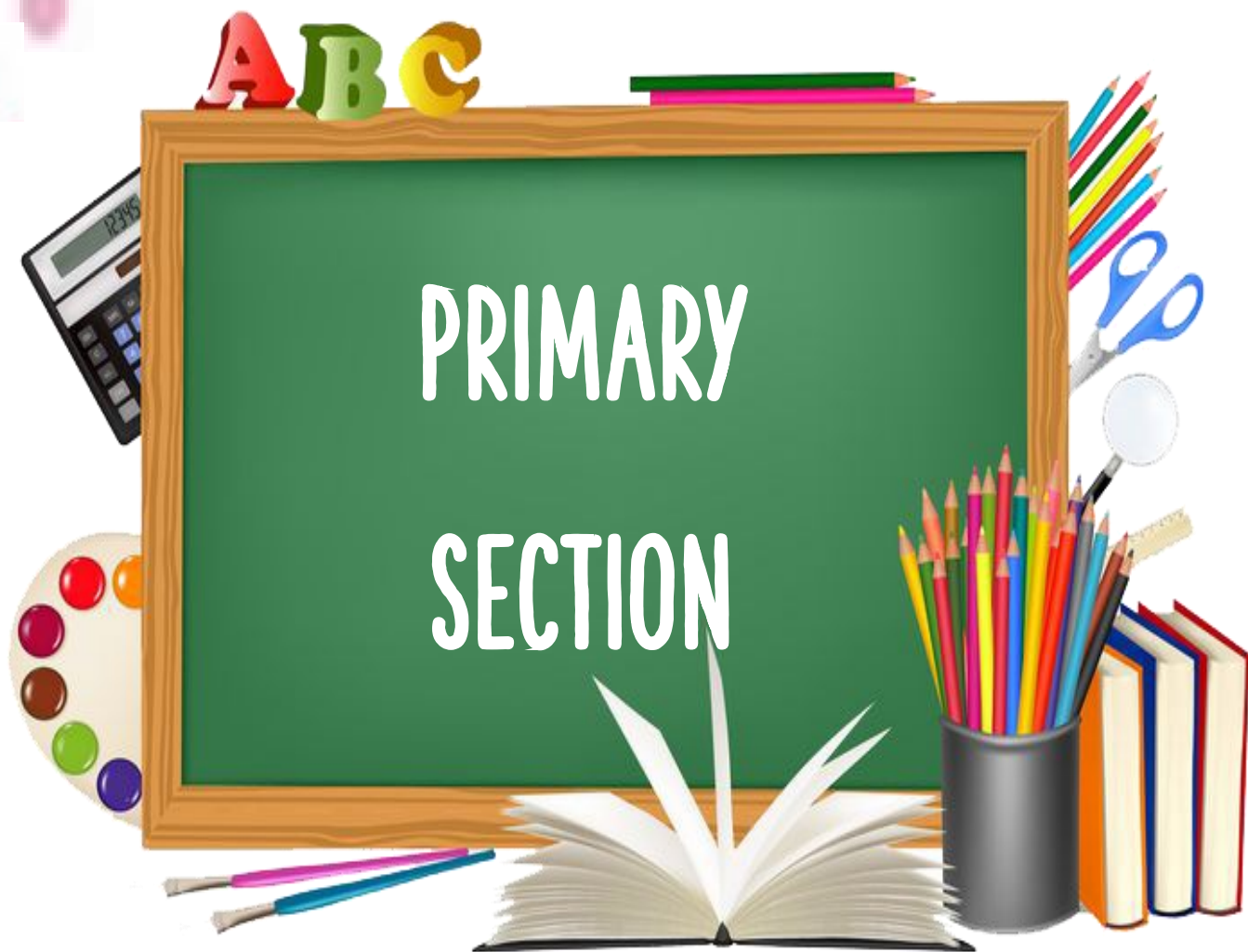
Kindergarten children did colouring activity (National flag of Oman) on 18/11/2021, Thursday. Omani teachers distributed sweets to all the children.

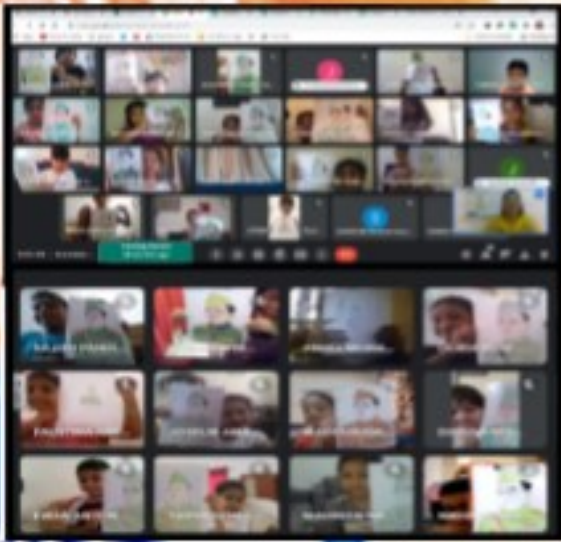


GLOBAL HAND WASHING DAY

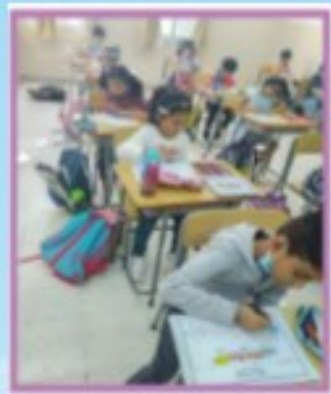
The Onsite Classes for classes 1 & 2 commenced on 7th November 2021.

Various fun filled games were also part of Children's Day celebration. A colouring activity was also conducted for both onsite and online children.



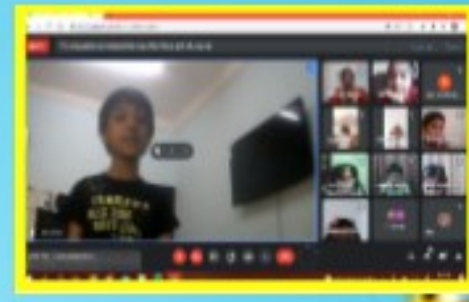
INTERNATIONAL CIVIL AVIATION DAY

International Day of Girl Child was celebrated on October 11th, in order to bring the similarity among the genders and also to bring along the awareness of respecting and caring for girl child.

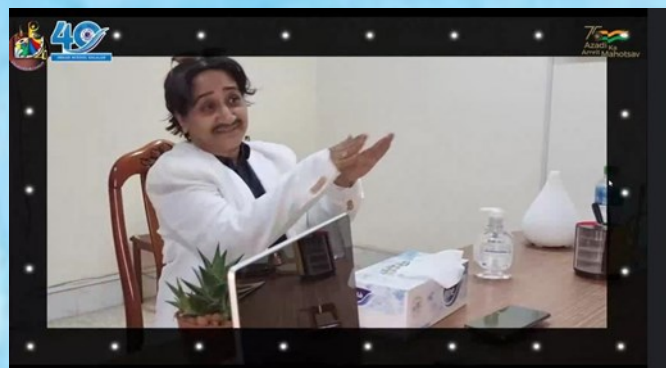
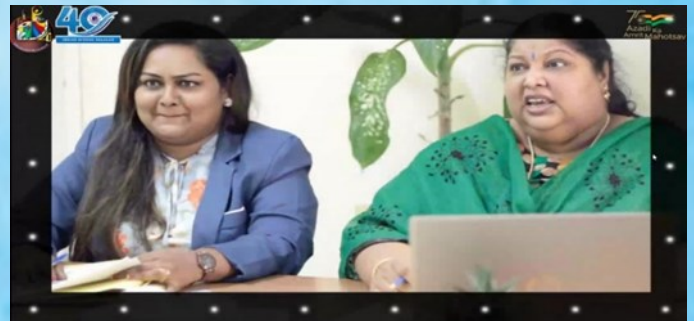


World Science Day for Peace and Development

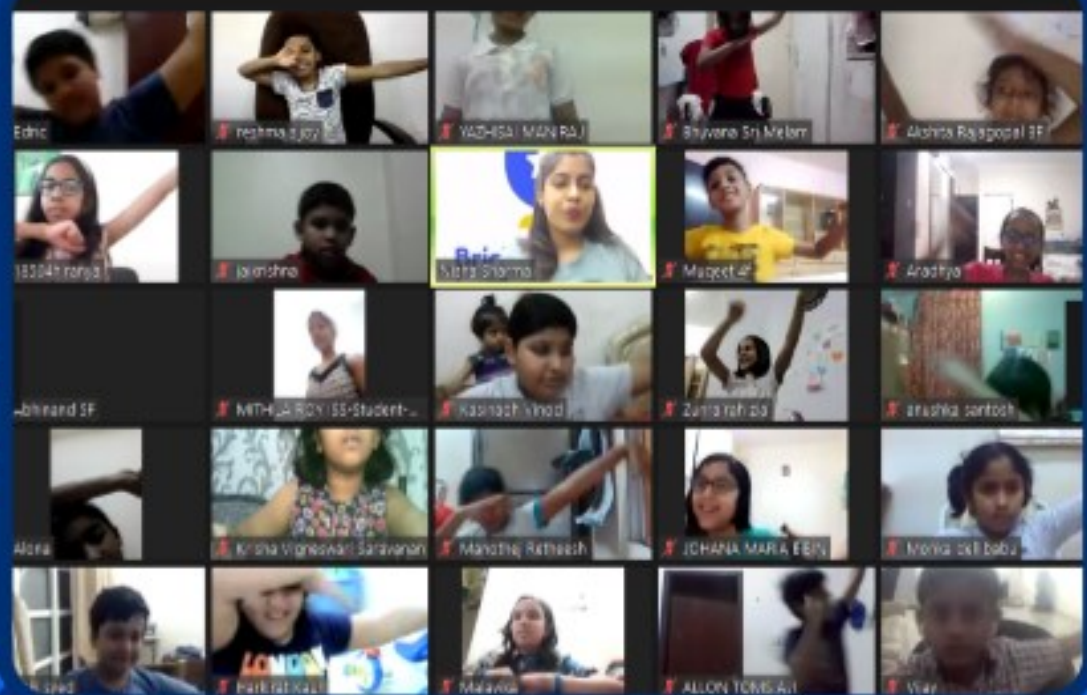

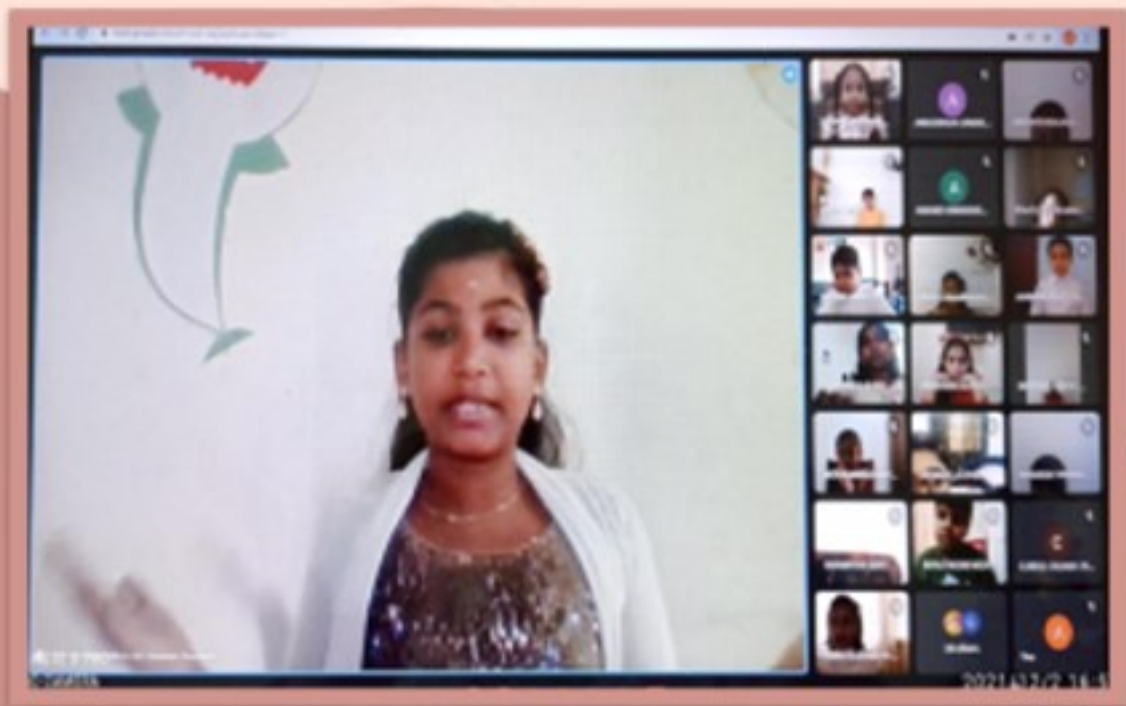
NATIONAL COMPUTER SECURITY DAY

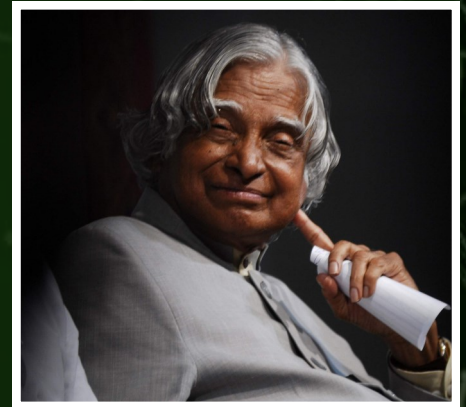

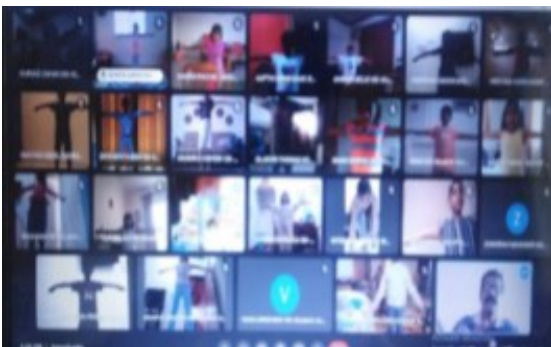
The topics were explained with the help of Video lessons/PPT/demonstrations by the teachers to make the lesson more interesting and easy to understand.
