

on this with the aim to increase the standard of the teaching and learning process and to acquire the accreditation at the earliest, so to bring the school to international standards.




Mr. Deepak Patankar requested a *collaborative* effort from all the staff members to avail the accreditation within a year.



Communication and information technology have played a crucial role in bringing the world close. Postal service was the early means of communication.




The purpose of celebrating World Post Office Day is to create an awareness on how the postal sector functions. The UKG children made models of post box, envelope and stamp during the online activity.

The children enjoyed the activity to the fullest and it helped them to understand the earliest means of communication - The Post Office.


WORLD STUDENTS' DAY(15/10/2020)




EMOTIONS ' DAY (28/10/2020)

Educating students about the community helpers and the kind of roles they play in our daily lives, is highly important. Indeed, they remind us of how interconnected we all are when





CHILDREN'S DAY






TOLERANCE DAY


CCA EVENTS






REPUBLIC DAY

SENIOR SECTION

RE-OPENING OF SCHOOL AFTER THE LOCKDOWN

Re-opening schools, even in a phased manner poses a lot of challenges for the school authorities and the management, but Indian School Salalah weathered the storm as it commenced the regular schooling on Sunday, 10th January 2021, for its students after a long break due to the COVID-19 pandemic as per the decision of the Supreme Committee and following the guidelines issued by the Ministry of Education for schools in Oman.

Initially, class XII Science batches attended the school for their Science and Computer Science practical sessions. Various measures had been put in place, from social distancing to staggered school times, to keep students and staff safe and reduce the likelihood of transmitting germs. To ensure

safety and security of each child and the staff attending school, school had asked students and staff to furnish Self Declaration Health form and provided guidelines and SOP to be followed while attending the sessions. After being successful in this venture, Pre-Board Examination for grades 10 and 12 and Final Examination for grades 9 and 11 were conducted successfully in the school premises.

Staff were assigned at the two main gates to monitor each student. Their body temperature was measured and recorded and ensured that they had all the protective measures like gloves, face shield mask and hand sanitizer. The school also arranged facilities for isolation, First Aid, ambulance etc. in case of emergency.



INDIAN SCHOOL SALALAH HOSTS THE SECOND EDITION OF 'GLINTS-GOING BEYOND'-MEET-THE-LEADER PROGRAMME



Indian School Salalah, under the aegis of the Board of Directors, Indian Schools in Oman, organized the second edition of Meet-the-Leader programme titled “GLINTS - Going Beyond”, on 12th January 2021 on virtual platform. “GLINTS – Going Beyond” is an initiative by the BOD to empower the educators by interacting with the great teachers who have brought a positive transformation in the society and to acquire the skill that enables a person to go beyond the precincts that binds him.

The resource person for the second edition was Mr. Anil Pradhan, an Indian engineer, innovator and revolutionary educationist also known as the “Ideas Man of India.” He is the founder of Navonmesh Prasar Foundation and School for Rural Innovation (IPSFRI), which was founded in 2015 to educate the less-privileged students of Odisha through an interdisciplinary curriculum. The mission of this exceptional leader is to create a thirst for innovation among students so that every student, regardless of their background, becomes an achiever and this helps in the progress of the country.

In the interactive session with the principals and teachers of 21 Indian Schools in Oman, Mr Anil Pradhan shared the experience of his journey from a civil engineer to that of an innovator who wants to make the future generation ‘entrepreneurs’ and not mere ‘employees.’ He opined that students become self-motivated when curiosity develops in them and for this, one must shift from passive learning to hands-on experiential learning and exploration. He concluded his speech by requesting all the teachers to ‘believe’ their students, consider them as their own children and teach them from heart.

It was followed by the question answer session, where Mr. Anil clarified the doubts that teachers had. To a question asked regarding how to incorporate interdisciplinary courses, Mr. Anil elucidated that with a positive mind and a willingness to take up the risk, one can surely make a difference. He also said that the National Education Policy (NEP)2020, has incorporated interdisciplinary learning which would be beneficial for the students to get equipped themselves. The views shared by Mr. Anil were truly an eye opener for all the teachers.

Mr. Deepak Patankar, Principal, Indian School Salalah expressed his heartfelt gratitude to Dr. Baby Sam Saamuel, Chairman, Board of Directors, Indian Schools in Oman for giving an opportunity for all the Indian school teachers across Oman, to interact with the great teachers who have made a difference. Overall the session was enriching and fruitful. The session came to an end with the vote of thanks proposed by the moderator, Mrs. Rachel Abraham, faculty, English Department, Indian School Salalah.



Students of class 3, 4, 7 and 8 presented a plethora of cultural programmes and



COMPETITIONS - The Weekly Online Chess Tournament was conducted for students of class. 3-12.



