SECTION A (READING)

1. Starting next month, the city's innovative solar panel project will enter the "installation phase" bringing clean energy to thousands of homes for an extended period. From March 15 to 30, the weather department predicts cloudy skies that might slow down the solar panel installation process across the city.
2. A senior Municipal Corporation official said, "This will be the first time that we will have weather challenges for such a long period of about 15 days. During this period, there will be reduced efficiency in installation work," he added.
3. Expressing confidence about completing the project once the cloudy weather clears, he said, "the timeline has been tested and the installation schedule will be maintained." The project's duration has been extended for another three months in February due to additional funding from the government.
4. Stating that the project team has been "prepared" for the weather challenges, the Municipal official said, "we are not stopping any installation work now. Till March 15, several hours of work will continue daily that will be for about six to seven hours per day." In April next year, the project will have to face similar weather challenges once again, if there is another expansion when monsoon season arrives.
5. Making environmental history, the city last month successfully launched its ambitious solar energy program covering residential areas in its very first phase, joining an elite group of five eco-friendly cities in the country.

1. After more than two years of remote learning, India's education sector is now cautiously optimistic. Education technology constituted almost 2% of India's digital economy and created around 50 million learning opportunities in 2019. But the sector experienced dramatic changes in India - like in other countries - in the past two years.
2. Students are now learning with great enthusiasm - 'learning surge', as educators call this phenomenon. And many, teachers say, now prefer to use digital tools along with traditional classroom methods instead of relying only on textbooks. The education sector is also benefiting from new trends born during the pandemic such as hybrid classes and virtual field trips.
3. According to a recent study, 55 percent of Indian students believed that online learning remained an important way of gaining knowledge and connecting with global educational resources. Over two years, the study said, Indian students are now excited about blended learning methods and more than 75 percent of students are enthusiastic about combining digital and classroom learning.
4. There has also been an increase in the number of students participating in online skill courses. The growing interest in digital skills is due to the pent-up demand from the pandemic's two-year period. This has become more pronounced because of rising career aspirations and accessibility among middle-class students from smaller towns and cities.
